

KIRK MITTELMAN

Kirk teaches all levels of EMT's and wilderness medicine and is the Paramedic Program Director for the Mt Nebo Paramedic Program, which is affiliated with the University of Utah. Kirk is a 31-year veteran of EMS and Public Safety. In his spare time Kirk travels to 3rd World countries as a volunteer teaching EMS to physicians, nurses and EMS personnel. When things get too hectic Kirk can be found waterskiing and enjoying the sun at Lake Powell.

MARGARET MITTELMAN

Margaret is an Associate Professor and the EMT Program Coordinator for Utah Valley University and a Utah practical test team proctor. A 30 year EMS veteran, Margaret is a favorite presenter at both State and National Symposiums, gaining notoriety for her portrayal of Ann Robinson of "The Weakest Link."

DWIGHT POLK

Dwight is the Paramedic Program Director at the University of Maryland Baltimore County. He has a Master's Degree in Occupational Social Work and is a Crisis Counselor for the Grassroots Crisis Center and two Critical Incident Stress Management teams in Baltimore.
